#### **COOKIE INFORMATION**

The software applications used may contain "cookie" technology.

Cookies are primarily intended to facilitate user web browsing.

Cookies can provide information while browsing in the website and enable the functioning of specific services which require identification of the user's path through different pages of the website.

For any access to the web-portal regardless of the presence of a cookie,

the type of browser, the operating system (e.g. Microsoft, Apple, Android, Linux, etc.), the Host and the URL of each visitor are recorded, in addition to the data on the requested page. However, the user has the opportunity to set his browser in order to be informed when a cookie is received and decide to delete it consequently.

Further information on cookies can be found on the websites of the browser providers.

#### What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are stored on your computer when you visit certain web pages. In most browsers cookies are enabled, at the bottom of the page all the necessary information to change the cookie settings on the browser. Please note that the cookies we use can't harm your computer. We don't store personally identifiable information in the cookies we use, but we do use encrypted information gathered from cookies to help us to improve your experience of our website. For example, they help us to identify and resolve errors.

Cookies can perform different functions, such as surfing through the different webpages efficiently and in general can improve the user's permanence.

The owner reserves the right to use cookies, with the approval of the user where the law or applicable regulations allows it, in order to facilitate surf on the website and customize the information that will appear. The owner also reserves the right to use similar systems to collect information about site users, such as for example type of internet browser and operating system used, for statistical or security purposes.

## Types of cookies (Terminology)

Cookies are then divided into "session" and "persistent", the first ones, once downloaded, are then deleted when the browser is closed, the persistents are stored until their expiration or cancellation. The session cookies used are intended to speed up the analysis of Internet traffic and make it easier for users to access the services offered by the website.

Session cookies are mainly used during authentication, authorization and surfing in the services accessed through a registration. Most browsers are set to accept cookies.

If you do not want to accept cookies, you can set your computer to refuse them or display an alert when they are archived.

If the user refuses the use of cookies, some website features may not work properly and some of the services may not be available.

The use of session cookies is strictly limited to the transmission of session identifiers, necessary to allow a safe and efficient exploration of the website.

These data have a technical nature, temporary validity and are not collected with the aim to identify users but, due to their operation and in combination with other data held by third parties (for example the Internet connection provider of the user), they could allow the identification. These cookies are readable only to the domain that created them.

#### What cookies we use:

<u>Technical navigation cookies:</u> They are cookies that guarantee the web navigation and the use of the website allowing the connection between the server and the user's browser.

These cookies are indispensable for web navigation (for example session identifiers) which allow the main features of the site to be used and to protect the connection.

Without these cookies, the website could not be used normally

<u>Functional cookies</u>: They are cookies stored in the computer or other device which, based on the user's request, record the user's choices, to allow him to remember them in order to optimize and provide an improved and personalized web navigation within the service or access to the web site. (e.g. registration in restricted areas, storage of products in the cart to have the possibility of finding them in the next session, saving the selected language, viewing a video or the possibility of commenting on the blog etc.).

Functional cookies are not essential to operate the web site, but they improve the quality and experience of the web navigation.

<u>Analytical cookies</u>: They are cookies that collect information on how the user uses the website, such as which web pages have been visited most often.

This website uses third-party cookies "Google Analytics".

Google Analitycs is a site of statistics, for example it calculates the number of visitors, what kind of technology they are using (for example Mac or Windows), how much time they spend on the website ... All data collected is anonymous and in aggregate form therefore not profiling. The information generated by the cookie on the use of the website by the user (including the IP address) is transmitted, and stored on Google's servers.

## How can I disable cookies?

Warning: according to the deactivation by the user of all types of cookies (including technical ones) it is specified that some features of the site may be reduced or not available.

Most browsers accept cookies automatically, but you can also choose not to accept them.

If you don't want your computer to receive and store cookies, you can change your browser's

security settings (Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Safari, etc.).

There are several ways to manage cookies and other tracking technologies.

By changing your browser settings, you can accept or refuse cookies or decide to receive a warning before accepting a cookie from the websites you visit.

You can delete all the cookies installed in your browser's cookie folder. Each browser has different procedures for managing settings. Cookies can be disabled directly from your web browser.
